#### SUMMER TIME PROJECTS

Do you have some of those summer-time projects in your future over the next couple of month? That woodworking...landscaping...clean-out...paint...refinish project that you've been waiting on better weather in order to accomplish?

These days your staff is doing some self-evaluation – questioning our personal and church goals – where we are with un-finished projects – laying out some goals / projects for the Summer & Fall. Pray for us, for God's leadership, and for our efforts in the coming months.

### SUMMER-TIME THIRST

When you've been out in the hot sun, the thirst builds. Or when you've been working steadily all day long and haven't stopped for lunch, the hunger builds.

Lord willing, in the next couple of months we'll look at the spiritual discipline of fasting.

Fasting is the abstinence of something with a spiritual goal in mind (biblical reference is usually food). It is desperately seeking the face, presence, and hand of God in such a way that we set aside any distraction, stating to Him that our relationship with Him is what matters most.

It is a thirst and hunger for God, expressed for our benefit by David Ps.63:1 – *God, You are my God; I eagerly seek You. I thirst for You; my body faints for You in a land that is dry, desolate, and without water.* 

That deep longing / desire is also expressed in Ps.42:1-2 – As a deer longs for streams of water, so I long for You, God. I thirst for God, the living God. When can I come and appear before God? Of course the short answer to that question is ANYTIME!

As we thirst and hunger for God's presence, we find in Jesus such a great promise – Jn.6:35 – "I am the bread of life," Jesus told them. "No one who comes to Me will be hungry, and no one who believes in Me will ever be thirsty again."



# Six Things Every Parent Should Know About Play

1. **Children learn through their play.** Don't underestimate the value of play.

### Children learn and develop:

<u>cognitive skills</u> – like math and problem solving in a pretend grocery store

<u>physical abilities</u> – like balancing blocks and running on the playground

<u>new vocabulary</u> – like the words they need to play with toy dinosaurs

<u>social skills</u> – like playing together in a pretend car wash <u>literacy skills</u> – like creating a menu for a pretend restaurant

Play reduces stress. Play helps your children grow emotionally. It is joyful and provides an outlet for anxiety and stress.

- 3. Play is more than meets the eye. Play is simple and complex. There are many types of play: symbolic, sociodramatic, functional, and games with rules—to name just a few.
- 4. **Play and learning go hand-in-hand.** They are not separate activities. They are intertwined.
- 5. **Play outside.** Remember your own outdoor experiences of building forts, playing on the beach, or playing with other children in the neighborhood. Make sure your children create outdoor memories too.
- 6. Play is a child's context for learning. Children practice and reinforce their learning in multiple areas during play. It gives them a place and a time for learning that cannot be achieved through completing a worksheet. For example, in playing restaurant, children write and draw menus, set prices, take orders, and make out checks. Play provides rich learning opportunities and leads to children's success and self-esteem.
