Pastor's Ponderings

We've always seemed to have a fascination for things that are connected with famous people. Leonardo da Vinci's 72 page journal named the *Codex Hammer* was sold to billionaire Bill Gates in 1994 for a cool \$30.8 million. Some of Elvis Presley's hair went for \$15k at auction in 2009, much reduced from the \$115k price tag some sold for only 7 years earlier. His Bible was also sold – it brought \$94k. An original drawing of Winnie-the-Pooh's *The Hundred Acre Wood* map, and 4 other sketches created by E.H. Shepard in 1926 was auctioned last year for \$600k. These things are valuable because they once belonged to someone significant.

While I write this I'm studying 1Peter 2 in preparation for a sermon on the passage. One phrase stands out to me in particular – 1Pt.2:9 says, *…you are a… people for His own possession…* Yes, I know that some translations render it, *a peculiar people*, but the word refers to a private possession.

As He entered into covenant with the Israelites at Sinai, God told them that *you shall be my treasured possession among all peoples…* (Ex.19:5) Several times throughout the OT God reminds His people that they are valuable because they belong to Him.

Our standing, in 2019, is that if we know Jesus in salvation, we have great value because we now belong to Him. We have not replaced Israel in God's plan, but have been "grafted in" and allowed to share in that plan. We are valuable because we belong to Someone significant. Of course, that Someone is the Lord Jesus!

Don't spend your summer trying to figure out your worth / value! You have great value because you belong to the Priceless / Precious Son of God! That makes you priceless also!

But what is a "valuable" or "priceless" one to do? Peter also tells us that – ... *proclaim the excellencies of Him who called you...into His marvelous light*. If you owned one of the above items, you'd enjoy letting everyone around you know that it was now in your possession. Spend your summer telling everyone you come into contact with that you are now in His possession!

Keep praying for our Assoc. Pastor of Worship Search Committee as they interview candidates and stay sensitive for God's leading. Also pray for Ethan Yates as he serves as our official interim and as Jimmy Murdock rehearses with our Adult Choir. God has a "priceless" one for us out there who will be privileged to serve with our "priceless" people at FBCA!

Daycare News

How do I know if my child is ready for kindergarten? It's a question every parent or guardian asks him/herself as their child approaches the time when kindergarten looms. As parents and guardians, we want to do everything we can to make sure our children start off their educational career on the right foot.

Skills a Child Ideally (But not Necessarily) Demonstrates by the Time They Enter Kindergarten

EMOTIONAL SKILLS	ACADEMIC SKILLS
Ability to separate	Interest in reading
Ability to transition from activity to activity	Familiarity with the alphabet
Ability to advocate for oneself	Understanding of numbers/quantity
Curiosity	
Gets along with others	

The first step to being ready for kindergarten revolves around emotions. Does the child engage with the world around them, ask questions, and show curiosity about other kids? These are things parents should see in their children as they reach age 4 and 4-and-a-half to indicate the child is emotionally ready for kindergarten. If children can get along with other children their age, participate in group activities, share and have empathy for others, then they are emotionally prepared for kindergarten.

The experts note that academic readiness is secondary to emotional readiness when it comes to being ready for school. 'Teachers are less concerned with what children know coming in, and are more concerned if children can come in, sit down, and follow multi-step directions. The child doesn't have to be ready academically as the goal is to introduce information in kindergarten."

So while, ideally, your child will exhibit certain traits and have some skills, not all children will be in the same place. This is to be expected. Success can occur with time, modeling, and growth. By the way, remember transitions take time. Experts say those first days, weeks, and even month are about learning routines. Give the experience some time and most children will adapt just fine to kindergarten.
