<u>Discipleship</u>

One question that everyone ask at some point in their lives is, "What on earth am I here for?" The issue of trying to find purpose in life is one that continues, in one form or another, for most people's entire lives and mainly because we try to find the answer to the question in places, things and even people that never give us the right answer. Life is short and seems shorter everyday as your get older. The average lifespan is currently about 79 years. That is 28,855 days. What if, in 40 days or less, you could fully understand why you are on this planet and what to do with all those days? That is exactly what 25 or so of us are doing right now as we study through the classic book by Rick Warren "The Purpose Driven Life". We are about half way through our 40 days but I would encourage you, if interested, to join us even now. We are having a wonderful time learning and sharing together. If you cannot join us now, there will be additional offerings of this study in the future as well some small group/home group gatherings of "purpose" happening soon.

Coming in April, we will be offering a great practical tool being made available to everyone on Wednesday night called "Share Jesus without Fear" by Bill Fay. Many people who are believers never share the good news of Jesus with anyone. This is an unfortunate truth that plagues far too many believers today and it is completely correctable. You would be making an extremely wise decision to invest just 4 Wednesday nights to become a confident presenter of the Gospel and experience the joy of being used by God to fulfil his mission.

The Gospel Project makes it to the New Testament! In the fall of 2018 we started a new Sunday Morning Bible Study Curriculum that takes us through a chronological study of the entire Bible in 3 years. We teach the same lessons from Children through adults (age appropriate considerations made for children) so that families can discuss what they are learning together. Since we are beginning the New Testament this is a great time to invite new people to join your Sunday Morning Study and remind some of your people that have not been attending to come back and join in again.

There are many things going on in area of Discipleship in our Church currently, The Women's Ministry has new studies and small groups and makes available several women's conferences to increase your understanding and encourage you in your walk with the Lord and even the Men have an opportunity coming this summer to be a part of Promise Keepers Men's Conference.

Discipleship is process of becoming more like Jesus. I hope you will take advantage of these opportunities to do just that.

Notes from the Worship Pastor: The Rhythm of the Triune God

The choir is currently preparing for our Easter program (join us on Wednesday nights at 7:15!), and the worship team is continuing to faithfully serve each week. I'm humbled that I have been blessed to be included in FBC Alvarado's loving family and as a student at Southwestern Seminary. As I give thanks for these blessings and responsibilities, I recognize that they are given not by my own merit 'but through Christ in me' as the song says.

Songs like 'Yet Not I' remind me of the rhythms of worship that I've been learning to incorporate in Sunday services. I already mentioned one last month (the Rhythm of Revelation and Response), but in order to worship at all, there is a greater rhythm we must understand. The Rhythm of the Triune God and Man is foundational to how we understand worship.

The communion of the Trinity was going on in eternity past—before the world was made—and it was perfect in every way. Perfect worship took place in the relationships between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit even as it continues to take place now. We were created so that we might partake in this worship through the Voice of the Father, the Message of Jesus, and the Call of the Holy Spirit. The Triune God invites us into communion and worship with Himself that is only possible through each part of the Trinity. Our response to God's invitation is through the Holy Spirit in us, by the sacrifice of Christ, to the Father Himself.

Without this rhythm, we begin to believe that worship is about us, or that we must control and direct it. Without the Trinity, we place a heavy burden on worship leaders and head towards Unitarianism and divisive arguments over style. My prayer for our church is that we will delight in the Rhythm of the Triune God and Man as we humbly respond to God's glorious grace in grateful worship.
